



Environmental Policy

Purpose

We are a UK-based business supplying 3D-printing materials. This policy sets out how we manage our significant environmental impacts and continually improve our performance in a proportionate, practical way.

Scope

Applies to all activities under our control and influence, including procurement, manufacturing partners, logistics, warehousing, sales and marketing, customer service, and end-of-life initiatives.

Our Policy Statement

We will:

- **Comply** with applicable environmental legislation and relevant guidance in the UK and EU.
Prevent pollution and reduce environmental risk by maintaining reasonable controls across our operations and supply chain.
- **Use resources efficiently**, avoiding waste and seeking higher-value recovery options where feasible.
- **Continuously improve** our environmental management through measurable objectives reviewed at least annually.
Communicate responsibly, ensuring environmental claims are clear, evidence-based and not misleading.

How we put this into practice

1. Governance & Accountability

- Overall accountability rests with our Managing Director.
- Managers are responsible for implementing this policy within their functions; all colleagues are expected to follow associated procedures.

2. Planning & Risk

- Identify material environmental aspects (e.g., materials selection, packaging, transport, waste).
- Maintain proportionate controls and improvement plans for higher-impact areas.
- Keep appropriate records to demonstrate compliance and due diligence.

3. Materials & Products

- Source materials and components from reputable suppliers who meet applicable legal requirements.
- Avoid substances of concern and require suppliers to inform us of any relevant restrictions or declarations.
- Provide accurate, plain-English product information. Where we state recycled content or similar attributes, we will keep evidence to support the claim.

4. Packaging & Waste

- Apply the waste hierarchy: prevent, reduce, reuse, recycle, recover—before disposal.
- Segregate operational wastes where practicable and use licensed carriers and facilities.
- Work towards increasing recyclability and recycled content of packaging where commercially and technically viable.



5. Energy, Transport & Operations

- Seek operational efficiencies (e.g., consolidated shipments, sensible stock planning, minimal over-packaging).
- Encourage practical steps to reduce energy and fuel use within our influence.
- Monitor relevant intensity indicators proportionate to our size and data availability.

6. Marketing & Environmental Claims

- Use clear, specific language; avoid vague or absolute terms.
- Substantiate claims (e.g., recycled content by weight, recyclability in real-world systems) and keep evidence on file.
Do not rely on offsetting alone to describe a product or service as low/zero impact.

7. Suppliers & Partners

- Integrate environmental expectations into purchasing decisions and contracts where appropriate. Prioritise suppliers who can demonstrate compliance and provide reliable environmental data. Engage collaboratively to improve performance over time.

8. People & Training

- Provide proportionate training and guidance to teams whose roles affect environmental performance (operations, procurement, marketing, customer service).
- Share short "how-to" guides/checklists to make good practice easy and consistent.

Communication

This policy is published internally and externally.

We will respond to reasonable stakeholder requests for information and provide supporting evidence for material claims.

Raising Concerns

Colleagues and partners are encouraged to report environmental concerns or potential non-compliance to the Compliance/Regulatory lead. Issues will be reviewed and addressed promptly.
